#### Rules and Regulations for the Software Project Expo

### **General Guidelines**

### 1. Eligibility:

- Participation is open to students of UG (B.Sc.(CS), BCA, B.Sc.(IT, DS,AI) and Minority School Students
- Teams may consist of 4 members.
- All participants must register by the given deadline date 10.02.2025.

# 2. Project Categories:

- Projects may be submitted under specified categories (e.g., AI, Web Development, IoT, Game Development, etc.).
- Participants must indicate the category of their project during registration.

### 3. **Originality**:

- All projects must be original and developed by the participants.
- Plagiarism in any form will result in immediate disqualification.

### 4. Submission Requirements:

- Teams must submit a detailed project abstract by 24.02.2025.
- The final project must include a working prototype or demo, documentation, and a presentation.

# **Technical Regulations**

#### 5. **Project Development**:

- Projects may be developed using any technology, framework, or language unless specified otherwise.
- Use of pre-built templates, tools, or libraries must be credited appropriately.

#### 6. Hardware and Software:

- Participants must bring their own hardware and software resources.
- Internet access will be provided if required (confirm availability during registration).

### 7. Expo Setup:

- Each team will be assigned a booth/table to display their project.
- Teams must bring their own display equipment (e.g., laptops, monitors).



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# **Event Day Regulations**

#### 8. Presentation:

- Teams will have [e.g., 10–15 minutes] to present their project to the judges.
- Presentations should include the problem statement, solution, features, and demo.

### 9. Judging Criteria:

Projects will be evaluated based on:

- **Innovation**: Creativity and uniqueness of the idea.
- Functionality: How well the project works as intended.
- **Design**: Usability and aesthetics.
- Impact: Potential real-world application or benefit.
- **Presentation**: Clarity and engagement of the pitch.

### 10. **Time Management**:

• Teams must adhere to the given schedule for presentations and demonstrations.

### **Code of Conduct**

#### 11. **Behavior**:

- Participants are expected to maintain professional and respectful behaviour throughout the event.
- Harassment, offensive language, or disruptive conduct will not be tolerated.

### 12. **Safety**:

- Participants must ensure their project or demo does not pose safety risks.
- All setups must comply with the venue's safety guidelines.

### 13. **Property**:

- Teams are responsible for their equipment and materials during the expo.
- The organizers are not liable for any loss or damage.



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### **3Post-Event**

- 14. Awards and Recognition:
  - Winners will be announced based on the judges' decisions.
  - Certificates or prizes (if any) will be distributed during the closing ceremony.
- 15. **Project Ownership**:
  - Intellectual property rights of the project remain with the participants.
- 16. **Feedback**:
  - Teams may request feedback from the judges post-event for improvement.

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
